JOB TRANSITION BHP's Transition II Program for young adult students with disabilities had a terrific year. Most of the students went to jobs in the community during the year and gained many valuable work skills. Community placements included all three district cafeterias, Oasis Animal Sanctuary, Target, CVS, Snap Fitness, Sign-a-Rama, and Camden County Health Services. In addition to the daily operations of the school store and district print shop, students participated in lessons to improve academic skills necessary to make a smooth transition from school to work. They developed personal resumes, Power Point resumes, stock cover letters, reference lists and participated in mock job interviews. The class also went on the Spirit of Philadelphia for their year end trip with money they raised during the year. Congratulations to our program graduates for 2012. Best of luck to all of you! LEO CLUB The Leo Club started the year strong with 60 students signing up to become members. The beginning months are busy for the club because of training, recruiting, and running the blood drive. Club members volunteered to work at Back-to-School night. Volunteers assisted parents getting from place to place. In October, the regular October blood drive was moved to the Wednesday before Thanksgiving. A total of 149 students were recruited and 89 viable pints of blood were collected. The evening drive collected 24 pints. The month of October ended with 10 members volunteering their time at Blackwood's Pumpkin Festival.

During the month of December, Timber Creek's Leo Club joined forces with Highland's Leo Club for the Lions Breakfast with Santa. The two clubs took a bus trip on December 7 to Toys R Us in Deptford to shop for the children. The breakfast was held at the Gloucester Township's Democratic Club. The Spring Blood Drive had 145 students register to donate and 79 pints of blood were collected. The evening drive also saw a drop and collected 12 pints. The American Red Cross rewarded Timber Creek with \$1,500 for scholarship money. A peanut butter drive was held and the jars were donated to a local food pantry.

The History Club was also proud to be involved in a variety of activities to celebrate TC's Ten Year Anniversary, the December holidays, and Teacher Appreciation Week. All club members ended the year with a field trip to Independence Hall in Philadelphia. Through detailed planning, continuous student participation, and school-wide support, the History Club enjoyed an outstanding year.

TRANSITION PROJECT Transition Project is a statewide peer leadership program utilizing upperclassmen to help incoming freshman make a successful adjustment into the high school environment. Advisors Lauren Griffin and Suzanne Nordone led the way to another successful year. We are currently in our 6th year and continue to make an impact on the incoming freshmen. The Transition Project Program has a total of (135) upperclassmen (peer leaders) trained to work with the freshmen class. This year we welcomed (72) new juniors who were trained in September. Throughout the year, the peer leaders met once a month with a small group of freshmen during the freshmen gym periods. The leaders conducted lessons and activities centered around topics such as: Connections, Coping With Stress, Communication, Safety, Coping With Change, and Closure. We're looking forward to the 2012-2013 school year as we welcome 62 new peer leaders.

CONGRATULATIONS to Mr. Campbell's English classes and Ms. Mawson's World History class for winning the Black Horse Pike Achievement Contest sponsored by Empower3000. The students had the highest average scores using the Achieve3000 reading program from April 16th - May 31st. A representative from the company delivered soft pretzels and congratulations to the students.

PRE ENGINEERING In November, Mr. Smith's Pre-Engineering students designed, built, and tested their very own hot air balloons. Student's started off small by first building a 3 foot tall hot air balloon, but then quickly moved into the big leagues and developed their own 6 foot tall hot air balloons.
