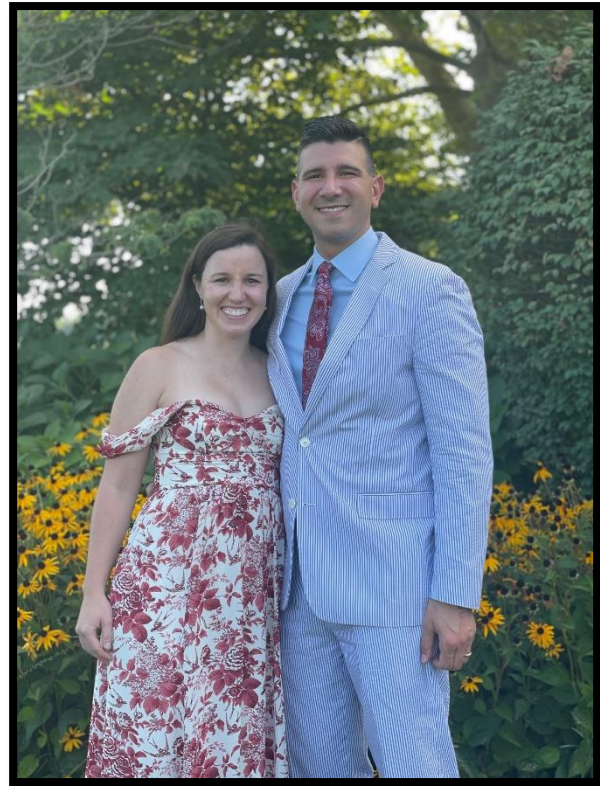




Black Horse Pike Regional School District Spotlight on Alumni Spotlight – October 2021

Upon graduation from Highland, he attended Ursinus College, where he majored in Business & Economics and graduated with a Bachelor's of the Arts in 2010. After spending several years in the private sector, he proceeded to attend law school, and graduated from Georgetown University Law Center in 2015 with a Juris Doctor and is a member of the Virginia State Bar.

Captain Moffa joined the United States Marine Corps in 2013 and activated in 2016. After attending the Basic School and Naval Justice School, Captain Moffa became a member of the Legal Support Services Section in Quantico, Virginia, where he served as Trial Counsel and Complex Trial Counsel. While stationed in Quantico, Captain Moffa was deployed to Afghanistan from 2019 to 2020 where he was Chief of Operational Law in the Office of the Staff Judge Advocate, United States Forces-Afghanistan. Captain Moffa is currently stationed at the Pentagon serving as Special Assistant to the Counsel for the Commandant.”
