
Black Horse Pike Regional School District Alumni Spotlight - NOVEMBER 2020

"Tony is currently the Superintendent of Schools at Millville Public Schools. He was Superintendent in Pemberton and Berlin Borough. - 1. AA: Upon graduation, what post-secondary path did you take and why?

 Anthony: I went into the family business of automotive repair. I then, after 10 years, decided to pursue a degree in mathematics and minor in education.

He interrupted the meeting to say, " Tony stand up! I'm not the only Mustang in the house." I was 45 years old, 27 years since I walked the halls of Triton. Mr. Cappelli had me walking on air!

Were there any moments or experiences that you can recall that helped you become the person you are today?

Anthony: Football 4,3,2,1 - All Olympic Conference Defensive End. Wrestling 4,3 - Captain my senior year. Golf 4,3,2. Student Council Treasure my senior year. French Club 4,3,2,1. Freshman to senior year was uneventful regarding any behavioral issues. I made some poor decisions in the spring of my senior year and learned that leaders are held to higher standards and consequences will be meted out. I teach my kids that I paid a small price back then for my actions (after putting forth a pretty successful 3.5 years). As an adult the price for poor decision making for my actions can come at a steeper price. I am glad I learned the lessons when I did.

7. AA: Please share any other favorite memories of the Black Horse Pike Regional School District, your HS in particular, that would inspire today's youth?

Anthony: Triton High School is a great place to learn. My motto for Triton students is, "You can get there from here!" Whatever that "there" is.... is up to you! Triton will provide you the necessary resources, you have to bring the dedication, effort and focus....as well as fun.
