



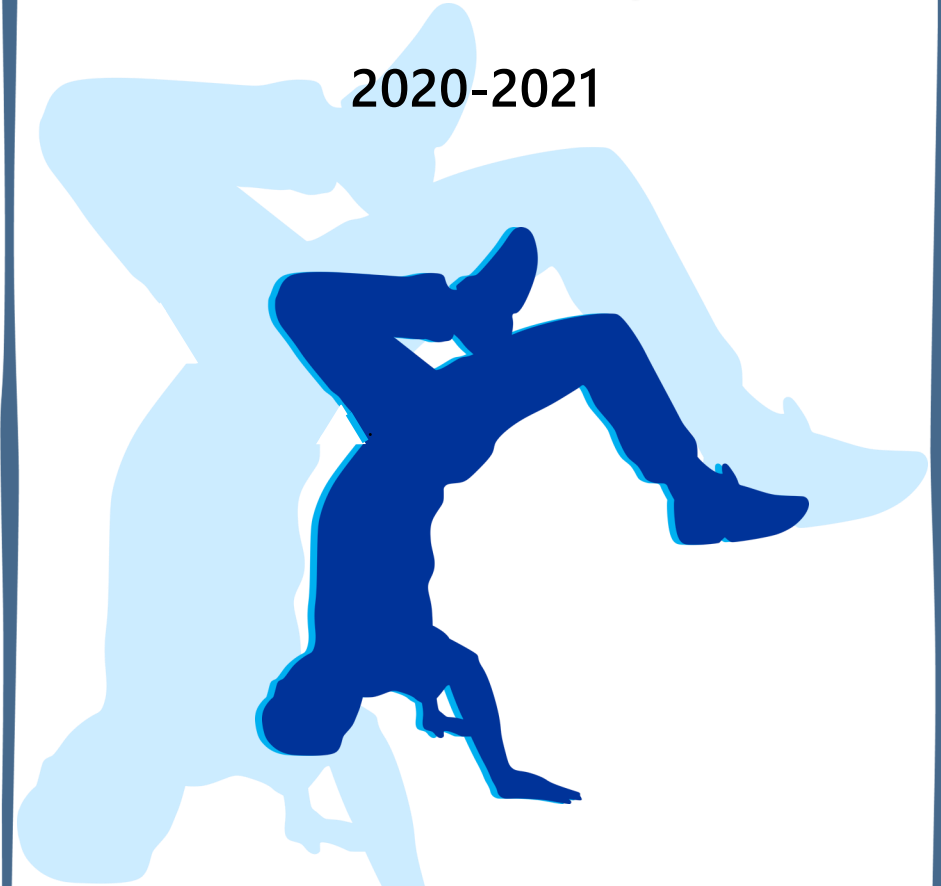

Service Clubs

BUDDY CLUB.....Ms. Linane and Mr. DiMaulo
