# Service Clubs

**GAY STRAIGHT ALLIANCE**......**Ms. Fowler** We hosted activities for Ally Week, created a LBGTQ+ Timeline (display in Front Lobby). We held a Morey's Pier summer pass sale and coordinated the Day of Silence. GSA held a Rita's

# Science and Technology

#### GREEN TEAM..
