

Finding your “Partner in Crime” Psychology Style- Summer Assignment For Mrs. Armstrong

You will:

1. Join Google Classroom. The classroom code is **tbnxkqn**

2. Read Chapter 1 in the textbook. There is a letter in classroom on how to get a copy of the textbook. After reading the chapter, you will be assigned a Learning Curve Activity. This is something that we will be doing all year. You have to answer the questions based on the reading. You have a target score you have to get to. You get there by answering the questions correctly. If you get it wrong, it may take you a little longer and you can look up the answer in the text. If you have any questions about Learning Curve, email me!
3. You will be assigned a psychologist below. This list will be on Google Classroom. If you are not in the class at the end of June, just email me and I will assign you a psychologist. For the psychologist you research you should create a “wanted poster. on a box”. All information belongs on a tissue box. (see examples in classroom)
 - a. Name of your psychologist.
 - b. Which perspective they fall under.
 - c. Their important contributions to psychology (MOST IMPORTANT COMPONENT). This can also include a visual.
 - d. A visual of your psychologist.
 - e. A reason they are “wanted” (you might have to be creative here, but that’s part of the fun).
 - f. A BRIEF BIOGRAPHY (as in, where are they from, where they were born, where they went to school and maybe one or two interesting facts.”
 - g. A quote from that psychologist.
 - h. Cite all sources used for your person(you should put the sources cited on the bottom of the box)

The goal of the summer assignment is for when we get back to school to do a psychology speed dating activity.

You will have three minutes with each other psychologist to decide who you would like to be your “partner in crime” and who would be your “arch-nemesis.” Prepare a 90 second introduction with key highlights about your FIRST PERSON.
