Dual Credit v AP

Dual Credit:

The Black Horse Pike Regional School District and Camden County College (CCC) have an agreement for a variety of college level courses where students can earn college credits while still in high school.

- > Application process each Fall
- > Only ONE application is required (no matter how many courses a student is applying for)
- Checks are made out to "Camden County College" (NOT the attending HS)
- CCC typically charges one credit worth of tuition for each course (2014-15 = \$150.00)
- > A minimum grade is assigned in order to earn dual credit (see application)
- Students can begin requesting transcripts from CCC to be sent elsewhere around mid-July (if necessary)

AP classes and AP exams:

Each high school in the Black Horse Pike Regional School District (BHPRSD) offers a variety of Advanced Placement (AP) courses in English, Fine Arts, Mathematics, Science, and Social Sciences. Enrollment into AP courses is typically approved by the district departmental supervisors using teacher recommendations and grade requirements.

- > All AP courses are full year courses and weighted (*additional 1.0 grade point)
- > The CollegeBoard AP exams are in May. Scores vary from 1-5, 5 being the highest score.
- > BHPRSD students register for AP exams after winter break. Dates vary from year to year.
- Starting with the May 2015 Exams, the BHPRSD will pay for AP tests for any course AP course the student is enrolled in at Timber Creek.
