 The Bound of Education authorizes a prompt investigation of reports and violations and complaints of housement, intimidation and bullying in accordance with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 18A.37-15(b)6.

The following investigation procedure shall be used for all allegations or barassment, intimidation, or bullying:

An investigation shall be initiated by the Principal or the Principal's designed within one school day of the report of the incident and shall be conducted by a achool's Anti-Bullying Specialist.

 The Principal may appoint additional personnel who are not school Anti-Easilying Specialists to assist in the investigation.

I he investigation shall be completed as soon as possible, but no later than ten school days from the date of the written report of the medient of harasament, intimidation, or bullying

in the event that there is information relative to the investigation that is anticipated but not yet received by the end of the ten day period, the school.

Anti-Bullying Specialist may amend the original report of the results of the investigation to reflect the information.

. The results of the investigation shall be

ported to the Superintendent of Schools within two school days of the completion of the investigation, and in accordance with regulations presented by the State Board of Education pursuant to the "Administrative Procedure Act," P.I., 1968, c, 110—(

The Superintendent of Schools may decide to provide intervention services, establish fraining programs to reduce harmonent.

instraidation, or bullying and enhance school climate, impose discipline, order counseling as a result of the findings of the investigation, or take or recommend other appropriate action.

The results of each investigation shall be reported to the Board of Education no later than the date of the next Board of Education Meeting following the completion of the investigation, along with information on any services provided, training established, discipline imposed, or other action taken or recommended by the Superintendent.

Parents or logal guardians of the pupils who are parties to the investigation shall be entitled to receive information about the investigation, in accordance with Foderal and State law and regulation, including the nature of the investigation, whether the dissinct found evidence of harasament, intimidation, or hallying, or whether discipline was imposed or services provided to address the investigation of harasament, intimidation, or bullying. This information shall be provided in writing within five school days after the results of the investigation are reported to the Board of Education.

A purent or logal guardian may request a hearing before the Board of I ducation after receiving the information.

This hearing shall be held within ten days of the request

The Board shall most in executive session for the hearing to protect the confidentiality of the pupils; and

At the hearing the Board may hear from the school Anti-Bullying Specialist about the meident, recommendations for discipline or services, and any programs instituted to reduce such incidents.

As the next Board of Education meeting following its receipt of the report, the Board of Education shall issue a decision, in writing, to affirm, reject, or modify the Superintendent's decision. The Board's decision may be appealed to the Commissioner of Education, in accordance with the procedures set forth in law and regulation, no later than ninety days after the issuance of the Board's decision.

A parent, pupil, logal guardian, or organization may file a somplaint with the Division on Civil Rights within one hundred eighty days of the occurrence of any incident of hunassment intimidation, or bullying based on membership in a protected group as enumerated in the "Law Against Discrimination," P.1.1945, c.169 (C.10:5-1 of seq.).
