



An "I am..." video created with the help of SADD Club will air every Monday in October and various PSAs from the Foundation for a Better Life will air on the Morning News and focus on school violence awareness and respect themes.

"Peace" bookmarks – These bookmarks will be distributed to students and staffulty on Monday, October 21, 2013.

Joe Conlin from Prevention Plus will be speaking to our Health classes on Wednesday, 10/23. He will address the dangers of substance abuse and the inherent violence associated with these choices.

World of Difference and SADD Club will do a showcase in the Main Lobby called "Be a Bucket Filler" to promote Week of Respect and School Violence Awareness Week.

Affirmation Box – Every VP office will have a box of affirmations. The affirmations will be a reminder of their ability to make positive choices.

## October 21st - October 25th

- **Theme of the Month** Timber Creek's theme, "Respect is Earned Not Given. Be Strong. Be Positive. Be a Role Model. Be a Charger." will carry throughout the month of October.
- **Bookmarks** English teachers will distribute bookmarks to students during all classes. English teachers will also incorporate a Reader's/Writer's Notebook activity that coincides with the messages of anti-violence, respect, and tolerance. The bookmarks will be printed with Timber Creek's theme "Respect is Earned Not Given. Be Strong. Be Positive. Be a Role Model. Be a Charger." - **Presentations** (Thursday, October 24, 2013) Joe Conlin, law enforcement agent from Prevention Plus, will conduct 7 periods of presentations to all of Timber Creek's health classes. He will address the dangers of substance abuse and the inherent violence associated with these choices. Jennifer Brown, supervisor, has helped coordinate this effort.
- Classroom/Curriculum There are a number of classrooms and departments that will be promoting the message of school violence awareness through lessons on violence, tolerance, acceptance, and diversity.
- Youth Alliance Information/Resources are distributed to all teachers as a resource for conflict resolution.
- **Hallways** The SADD club will create posters and flyers to hang in the hallways to endorse school violence awareness and boost positive student interaction.
- **Affirmation Box** The counseling office will distribute positive affirmations. Students will be reminded to select an affirmation when they leave the office. The affirmations will be a reminder of their ability to make positive choices.
