# WHAT IS THE FSA ID?

- The FSA ID is a username and password used by students, parents, and borrowers to log in to the U.S. Department of Education online systems and to electronically sign documents.
- You use it to
  - apply for federal student aid at [studentaid.gov/fsaid](https://studentaid.gov/fsaid)
  - sign for a federal student loan; and
  - perform important activities such as choosing a repayment plan or applying for a deferment on your federal student loan.

- Don't include personal info such as date of birth or name.
- If you see a message "The username you entered is already in use," then someone has already used that username.

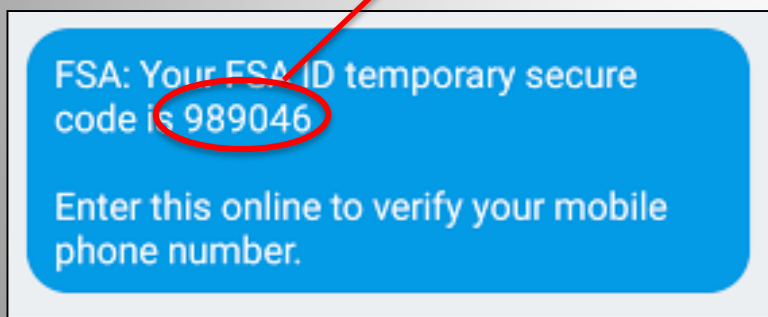
