SUBJECT: State-Issued High School Diploma

As announced in a <u>December 2013 press release</u>, the state of New Jersey has approved new high school equivalency assessments leading to the State-Issued High School Diploma. Students may now earn this diploma by passing one of the following tests: the GED® by GED Testing Service®, the Test Assessing Secondary Completion (TASCTM) by CTB McGraw-Hill, or the High School Equivalency Test (HiSET®) by Educational Testing Service (ETS).

As part of this change, the State Board of Education approved the elimination of the phrase "*General Educational Development or GED*" from its Administrative Code, and replaced it with *High School Equivalency Test*. Therefore, **any institution or place of employment requiring a State-Issued High School Diploma should accept passage of any of the approved equivalency tests**.
