SCHOOL VIOLENCE AWARENESS WEEK OCTOBER 21—25

Theme—"Respect is Earned Not Given. Be Strong. Be Positive. Be a Role Model. Be a Charger."

Bookmarks—English teachers distributed bookmarks to students and incorporated a Reader's/Writer's Notebook activity that coincided with the messages of Anti-Violence, Respect, and Tolerance. The bookmarks were printed with Timber Creek's theme "*Respect is Earned Not Given. Be Strong. Be Positive. Be a Role Model. Be a Charger.*" This activity raised awareness of violence in schools and encouraged positive student interaction. Thank you to Mrs. Marcie Geyer, Supervisor, she helped coordinate this effort.

PSAs—related to School Violence Awareness were read on the Morning Announcements by students from theatre class. They included Violence Awareness quotes and clips from the Foundation for a Better Life. With the help of Ms. Deich and Mr. McCoog, Timber Creek's "Respect Video" aired every Monday in October. This video showcased students and faculty expressing a message of respect to the school.

Presentations—(Thursday) Joe Conlin, law enforcement agent from Prevention Plus, conducted presentations Timber Creek's Health classes. He addressed the dangers of substance abuse and the inherent violence associated with it. Ms. Jennifer Brown, Supervisor, helped coordinate this effort.

Classroom/Curriculum—a number of classrooms and departments promoted the message of School Violence Awareness through lessons on Violence, Tolerance, Acceptance, and Diversity.

Youth Alliance Information/Resources were distributed to all teachers as a resource for conflict resolution.

Hallways—The SADD club created posters and flyers which hung in the hallways to endorse School Violence Awareness and boost positive student interaction.

Affirmation Box—The Counseling office distributed positive affirmations. Students were reminded to select an affirmation when they left the office. The affirmations were a reminder of the ability to make positive choices.

TRANSITION PROJECT Advisors Lauren Griffin and Suzanne Nordone led the way to another successful year. We are currently in our 8th year and continue to make an impact on the freshmen class. The Transition Project Program has a total of 137 upperclassmen (peer leaders) trained to work with the freshmen class. This year we welcomed (63) new Juniors who were trained in September. Throughout the year, peer leaders met once a month with a small group of Freshmen during the freshman gym periods. The leaders conducted lessons and activities centered around topics such as: Connections, Coping With Stress, Communication, Safety, Coping With Change, and Closure. We're looking forward to the 2014-2015 school year as we welcome (69) new peer leaders.

WORLD LANGUAGES CLUB During our trip to Cuba Libre in Philadelphia, we received a lesson on various dance styles of Latin America and then sat down to some fine Cuban cuisine. Our next trip was to the United Nations in New York City, club members were given a guided tour. After our free time in Rockefeller Center, we headed off to Sinigual, a Mexican Restaurant. This year the ensemble performed at our Winter Concert, Spring Concert, and our annual Festival of the Arts. The Jazz Ensemble also competed at Six Flags Great Adventure and took 1st place. The ensemble also entertained our Faculty, Staff and Administration at our annual Holiday Gathering. Students **Matthew Greger** (Guitarist) and **Michael O'Sullivan** (Drummer) auditioned for and were selected to perform with the *All South Jersey Jazz Ensemble*.

VOCAL ENSEMBLE (CHORALE) The Vocal Ensemble meets every Wednesday throughout the school year. This year, the group performed at our Winter Concert, Festival of the Arts, and Spring Concert. In addition, the group has performed at our annual Patriot Day Ceremony, sung at the N.H.S. Induction Ceremony, sung holiday carols through the halls of Timber Creek, performed for the Board of Education, (Girls only) and performed at our Graduation Ceremony. This year, the group attended a workshop in New York City with a cast member from the Broadway musical, *"The Phantom of the Opera."* The students learned a song and a dance from the show and then had a question and answer session with the cast member. Later that day, the group saw the musical and watched the professionals perform the same song and dance that the students had learned earlier that day.

NATIONAL HONOR SOCIETY In April, NHS inducted 74 new members (13 Seniors and 61 Juniors) bringing the total to 125 members. The key note speaker was Mr. Ed Benkin from KYW-1060 and WIP Sports Radio. The chapter continues to provide our own peer tutoring program for any high school students wishing to obtain additional help in any subject area. In addition, NHS members tutored Mullen middle school students. In January, NHS sponsored a real SAT practice test with the help of Kaplan Testing Services. In March, the chapter sponsored a blood drive in which 48 eligible donors helped to save 144 lives. In the spring, the chapter sponsored a Breakfast with the Easter Bunny for the community. In May, NHS sponsored an Italian Dinner with Keith Gipson providing dinner music and an Elvis Tribute Show. Over 200 hundred people attended the dinner.
