

An English or ELA-related club or activity typically focuses on reading, writing, speaking, or analyzing language and literature in creative, academic, or extracurricular ways. These clubs and activities can align with the skills and interests in English classes and offer students opportunities for deeper engagement.

These may not run at ALL schools.

Examples could include, but may not be limited to

Clubs

- **Poetry/Spoken Word** – Focuses on poetry writing and performance
- **Book** – Students read and discuss books of their choosing outside of class curriculum.
- **Fan Fiction** – Encourages creative writing based on existing books, movies, or shows.
- **School Newspaper** – Students write, edit, and publish articles on school and community events.
- **Yearbook** – Involves writing captions, headlines, and stories for the school's yearbook.
- **Theater Productions** – While more performance-based, theater relies heavily on script analysis and interpretation
- **Debate Club** – Enhances argumentation, rhetoric, and persuasive speaking skills
- **Mock Trial** – Requires students to analyze text, develop arguments, and present cases persuasively.
- **Podcast** – Students create and produce podcasts and work on storytelling and communication.
- **Film Analysis** – Discusses films through a literary lens, examining themes, characterization, and storytelling techniques.
- **Media** – Produces video reports, morning announcements, or school news segments.
- **Peer Tutoring** – Students help peers with reading, writing, and analysis skills.
