**Description:** We are going to prepare as though you are participating in the American Legion Oratorical Contest. The contest, to put it simply, is, "A constitutional speech contest."

You will be writing a speech (see the description below) and delivering it on tape (to be uploaded to Google Classroom). I will be the only one to see the video unless you choose to share it with the class in September. The segment of the competition we will be mimicking is called "The Prepared Oration." Here is the description of this segment:

- The oration (speech) must be on some aspect of the Constitution, with emphasis on a citizen's duties and obligations to our government.
- You cannot read your speech. You should prepare it and then deliver it based on memory.
- Quotations must always be indicated as such. Where quotations are more than 10 words in length, the author's name must be given in the manuscript and cited orally.
- Props are not permitted.
- The speech should be no fewer than six minutes, no more than ten minutes (in the actual contest the requirement is no fewer than eight minutes but for our purposes we are using six).
