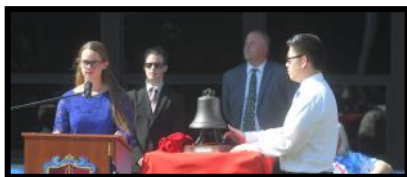

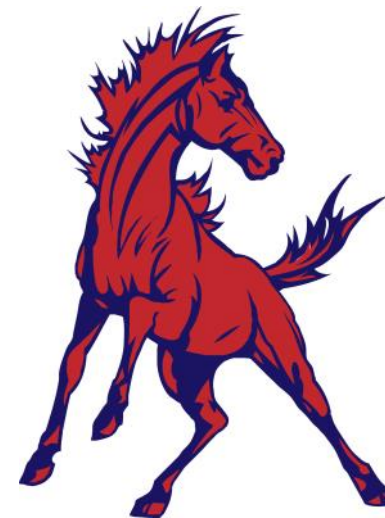

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ATTENDANCE INFORMATION

(Board Policy 5200)

All students are required to attend school for 182 days. *(In accordance with the provisions of N.J.S.A. 18A:38-25, every parent, guardian, or other person having control and custody of child between the ages of six and sixteen shall cause the child to **regularly attend school.**)* Any student absent (unexcused) more than 10 days will be subject to consequences as stated in the Board Attendance Policy. A student who accumulates absences (excused and unexcused) in excess of 20 days will be placed on No-Credit Status.

CREDIT RECOVERY PROGRAM:

The Credit Recovery Program will be assigned to students who have accumulated more than 10 unexcused absences. Underclassmen credit completion program will be at the conclusion of the school year. The program will start promptly at 7:30 a.m. and end at 4:00 p.m. daily. Participation in the program will cost \$50 per student. Hours will be determined by the student's Vice Principal dependent upon the number of accumulated absences. Senior Credit Completion will be offered during February, March, and June of the current school year. Police charges are filed once a student ages 14-16 is truant from school for 10 days.

ADMINISTRATIVE EARLY DISMISSALS

Administrative excuses are issued to students **only** in the event of an emergency. A parental/guardian phone call, as well as a note must be submitted to the vice principal's office before a student will be released. Please make an effort to keep doctor appointments and all early dismissals on an **extreme emergency basis.** Also, a student cannot be released unless a parent/guardian physically comes into the building with proper identification to accompany his or her child. Administration thanks you for your cooperation.

ABSENCES

Good attendance is a vital part of student success. However, if a student must be absent from school there are certain procedures to follow:

1. Notify school via a phone call for extended absences, (2 or more days).
2. Upon returning to school the student must present a signed parental/guardian note to his/her vice principal's office. The note must include your name, date(s) and reason for absence(s).
3. If students are absent five consecutive days, they must present a note from their physician in order to return to school.
4. If an absence lasts longer than 10 school days, provide your school counselor with a doctor's note and ask for details regarding our Homebound Instruction Program. See the Board Attendance Policy for further information.

LATE TO SCHOOL

Tardiness to school or class that is caused by a pupil's illness, an emergency in the pupil's family, the observance of a religious holiday, a death in the pupil's family, or by the pupil's compliance with a request or directive of an administrator will be considered justified and is excused. All other incidents of tardiness will be considered unexcused.

Four instances of unexcused lateness to school will equal one unexcused absence for the purpose of calculating unexcused absences for application of Board Policy/Regulation 5410- Promotion and Retention, Board Policy/Regulation 5200-Attendance, and Board Policy/Regulation 5460-High School Graduation.

A pupil who develops a pattern of tardiness, excused or unexcused, will be offered counseling with an appropriate staff member to determine the cause of the tardiness.

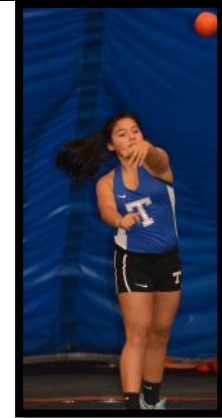

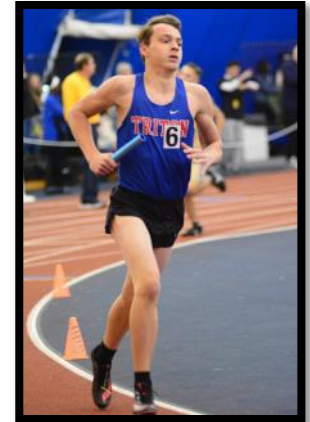
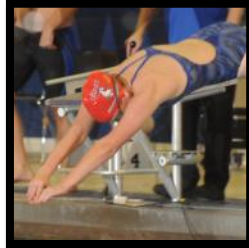

DRESS CODE

STUDENTS MUST FOLLOW

The Board of Education recognizes the right of parents and pupils to select appropriate clothing to be worn to school by pupils. For the most part, over the years these selections have been in good taste and have contributed to personal and school pride essential to learning.

The Board has a responsibility to ensure the health, safety, and welfare of pupils in the school and to maintain the environment conducive to the educational process. To that end, the Board establishes the following rules and regulations for those who need direction in determining what constitutes appropriate school and field trip attire.

- 1.** Clothing must be clean, in good repair, and worn neatly.
- 2.** Safe footwear is required. Pupils may not go barefoot or in stocking feet. Specific footwear may be required for certain courses (physical education, shops, science labs, etc.)
- 3.** Hats, bandannas, headbands, and any other headwear deemed inappropriate or disruptive by the administration must be removed upon entering the school building. Exceptions may be made for specific religious reasons (yarmulke, hijab, etc.). Hair bands used to control hair are acceptable.
- 4.** Clothing which causes a disruption or distraction may not be worn. Examples of this type of clothing include, but may not be limited to the following: tube tops, halter tops, see-through tops, bare back or midriff tops, fishnet or mesh tops. Pupils' shoulders and backs must be appropriately covered at all times.
- 5.** Pupils are prohibited from wearing any type of clothing, apparel or accessory which indicates that the pupil has membership in, affiliation with, or promotion of any gang associated with criminal activity. Obscene, indecent, or suggestive graphics and/or messages are not permitted. The same applies to messages favoring substance abuse, illegal activities, violence, or intolerance.
- 6.** Sunglasses may not be worn in the building unless prescribed by a physician. Prescription lenses, which darken with increased light are acceptable.
- 7.** Coats, jackets, are to be stored in pupil lockers during the school day.
- 8.** Students who wear a hooded shirt, hooded sweatshirt or other article of clothing in such a way as to conceal his/her identity will be subject to disciplinary action and prohibited from wearing a hooded shirt, hooded sweatshirt or similar apparel until further notice.
- 9.** Undergarments and sleepwear may not be worn as outer clothing at any time. This includes pants that are worn low to expose undergarments.
- 10.** Chain belts, cleat shoes, sharp jewelry, and other items which pose a danger to others or to school property are prohibited.
- 11.** Proper protective clothing is required in shop and laboratory areas as directed by teachers, including, but not limited to, headgear, coveralls, smocks, aprons, shoes, and safety goggles or glasses.
- 12.** Specific attire will be required to participate in physical education activity classes. Jewelry, including body piercing, may not be worn in physical education classes. Medical bracelets may be worn. Religious medals may be worn, but must be taped to the body and worn under the gym clothing. Failure to comply with the clothing requirement will result in exclusion from activity, which will affect the pupil's grade.

The final decision for suitability for attire rests with the building administrators. A vice principal's decision may be appealed to the building principal. The administration further reserves the right to determine if any article of clothing creates, or has the potential to create, a significant disruption or distraction to the school's learning environment.

For special dress or spirit days, the school principal may waive one or more of these rules and regulations.

When a pupil's does not comply with these rules and regulations, teachers shall send a pupil to the designated vice-principal's office. When appropriate, the vice-principal shall contact the parents/guardians of the pupil to require proper attire be brought to the school for the pupil as soon as possible. For repeat offenders, the vice-principal may invoke disciplinary measures such as administrative school detention, out-of-school suspension and/or issuing misconduct discipline points.

This policy shall be reviewed annually in accordance with a process developed by the school principal. Recommendations for changes shall be submitted to the superintendent for consideration by the Board of Education.

ACADEMIC HONOR CODE

We, the faculty, administrators, and Student Council representatives, encourage all students to achieve at the highest level of their abilities with **academic honesty and personal integrity**. Students should cultivate a positive attitude toward learning, derive pleasure from the discovery of new ideas and concepts, and strive to gain the best education they can. In the words of Thomas Paine:

"What we obtain too cheaply, we esteem too lightly; 'tis dearness only that gives everything its value."

The Academic Honor Code has been created to establish a common understanding among staff, students, and parents as to what constitutes cheating. The penalties are intended to promote growth in character and not simply to punish students.

To promote academic honesty, we encourage a sense of fair play with credit sought only, when it is deserved. The Honor Code serves as a guide to uphold academic honesty. To promote integrity, we remind students of the proverb:

"A good name is sooner lost than won."

Treasure your reputation, it is easier to maintain a good one than it is to regain a lost one.

Depending upon the severity of the violation, the penalties may include but are not limited to the following:

- * no credit or a zero
- * revocation of PRIDE Card or ineligibility for a PRIDE Card
- * notification of parent or guardian, counselor, vice principal and Honor Society Advisor
- * loss of membership in National Honor Society or loss of admission to NHS
- * disciplinary action by vice principal
